National Prohibition

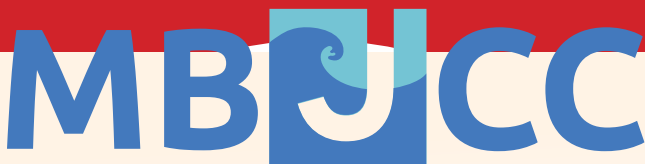
